Building relationships

I am very happy to report that we have held our first parent working group meetings at the school. On Friday morning of last week and on Monday evening this week we held an open discussion with parents representing students in all year groups centred around accelerating our improvement journey. meeting we looked at three areas, Engaging our families, effective communication and Strengthening our relationships in the community. Key dates and reminders

Last day of term - The school will be closing for the Christmas break on Friday 16th December at 12pm.

Academy Improvement Board

As you are aware from previous communications, in order to support and challenge our improvement journey TOVE Learning Trust have established an Academy Improvement Board (AIB) that meets half termly to assess our progress. Please see the feedback from our latest meeting.

AIB 4th November 2022 meeting

Our second AIB meeting of the academic year was to reflect on the early progress being achieved against the strategic objectives contained in the school improvement plan.

We reviewed, and discussed, a number of areas with key areas being student attendance, safeguarding and SEND provision.

The senior leader responsible for attendance provided a clear overview of the challenges facing the school to secure the improvements required. A robust action plan is in place and improvements are already being noted. A range of strategies have been planned and governors will receive regular updates on this key priority at future meetings.

Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility and an update from the senior leader responsible confirmed the robust procedures in place to protect everyone in school. Training records, and the feedback from this training, confirmed both the rigorous and proactive approach the school has to this priority area. Feedback from colleagues has also influenced the provision of additional training that has been well received.

SEND provision is a priority at Stantonbury and following a restructure of the SEND teamwork is accelerating around SEND provision. A recent comprehensive audit conducted by TOVE has identified key areas of focus moving forwards. Progress is being secured in areas identified and governors will closely monitor the action plan produced as an outcome of this audit.

On a recent school visit I was pleased to note staff and student commitment to key areas of change in teaching and learning. Staff compliance with the Do Now activities in lessons was proving effective in engaging students quickly and calmly with the learning in the lesson. Further to this I observed, alongside a few prospective parents and a Year 6 pupil, a lesson changeover. It was very calm and purposeful (with approximately 300 students moving at the same time) and an illustration of the high behaviour expectations the staff have of students but also that students have of themselves.
