Rewards

It has been great to welcome all our students back after the Christmas break and they have come back with a real focus. In both their lesson and around the school they are displaying the school values of Respect, Responsibility and Resilience in abundance.

During our second successful Parent Working Group meeting held at the school at the start of the month we received feedback around the lack of consistency in the implementation of both the Behaviour and Rewards policies. It was felt that some families were not familiar with our Behaviour Policy, specifically the 'C' system and some of our children were becoming disengaged if they were not being rewarded and recognised for their positive attitude to learning.

As a school we recognise the importance and impact rewards can have on your child's motivation, engagement and attitude towards both their subjects and staff. I have asked staff to take every opportunity to praise your child when they demonstrate any of our 3 values in their lessons and around school. Please take the time to ask your child about how many Achievement Points they have been awarded and look on Go4schools for daily and weekly updates. In addition next week we will send an overview of our Behaviour policy from a students perspective.

Open and honest communication

I wanted to make you aware of an issue both us and many schools in MK are facing and what we are doing as a school to stop and prevent the issue.

Vaping

Sadly the number of children vaping at school has increased and there seems to be a perception amongst many of our children that vaping "isn't that serious". I believe vaping is now more of an issue than smoking was or is because it's more discreet. It happens on the way to school, on the way home and unfortunately in school, mostly in the toilet blocks, and affects children in all our year groups. This week we have caught and sanctioned students in Years 7, 9 and Year 10. 8 students have been suspended this week for vaping. As a school we are taking a strong stance and we need your help to ensure the message gets to our young people and it changes their behaviour. For any student found vaping we

will issue strong sanctions, such as suspension.

It affects all of our community as many students don't want to use the toilet blocks due to

the number of students gathering there. Subsequently we have made changes to the way we students access the toilet during lessons and breaks and how we supervise and monitor the use of the facilities. I would like to thank you for your understanding of the changes that have been made to address this issue. I predict we will be able to review the situation in a few weeks once our students understand the strong stance we are taking.

Discount on furniture and white goods – Please find attached

The Re-use Community Project CIC is a community-based initiative that encourages the reuse of items that are no longer required, but that are still in good condition and that could be used by others. All profit made from the resale of goods is used to help various local charitable organisations and causes. There aim is simple – to alleviate poverty, reduce waste and tackle the Cost of living crisis.

They work closely with the council and other local agencies to help those who are supported by key workers, by providing priority household items that may be unobtainable due to circumstances beyond their control. Key workers may include Social Workers, Probation. Health visitors.
